We have successfully undergone transitions between executive teams and chapter leadership and have seen our members embark on successful careers in transportation engineering and planning and join ITE Hamilton after graduating from undergraduate and graduate programs with McMaster.

ITE McMaster were the 2017 Traffic Bowl winners at the annual ITE Canada Conference. In the summer of 2024, we hosted the Student Leadership Summit (SLS) at McMaster University as part of the ITE Canada Conference in Hamilton.

All About McMaster

McMaster University with its home in Hamilton, Ontario is home to over 6,500 undergraduate and 1,200 graduate engineering students, ranking 30th in the world in THE's Education's University Impact Rankings for 2024 and is Canada's 2nd most research-intensive university. The McMaster Civil Engineering Department is home to 24 faculty, with many focused on transportation and infrastructure engineering research as part of the departments research clusters. 

Field trips

Last year, we organised a site visit to the Waterloo Central Railway in St. Jacob's, Ontario, which featured a scenic ride on historic rail equipment through Waterloo and Woolwich County. Eventgoers went on a guided tour of the railway's St. Jacobs Restoration and Maintenance Facility, highlighting railway operations and historic preservation. Its success was marked by engaging content, hands-on experiences, and strong participation, effectively bridging industry knowledge
