## Re: CITE Hamilton Section Annual Report 2015 for CITE Activity Awards – Section Activities & Delta Award category

Canadian Institute of Transportation Engineers Hamilton Section is pleased to submit this annual report for consideration to the CITE Activity Awards under the Section Activities & Delta Award category. We have been aggressively involved in promoting the purpose and objectives of the Institute and below is a summary of the accomplishments from the past year – 2015.

## **Finances**

CITE Hamilton Section's finances remained stable through 2015. Overall, the Section's main revenue was \$559.77 from Membership Dues and \$5,855.00 from Luncheons. The Sections major expenditures during the year included \$5,769.96 for Luncheons and \$918.31 for the President's attendance at the ITE Strategic Plan Meeting, of which 50% was reimbursed by the District. Overall for 2015, a net decrease in cash on hand of \$358.14 was realized; this was chiefly attributed to a snow storm that severely limited attendance to one of the pre-planned Luncheons.

## **Meeting/Technical Activities**

The Hamilton Section typically organizes 4 (four) Technical Presentation Luncheons per year. In 2015, the Technical Presentation topics included:
