5 SECTION ACTIVITIES

5.1 Website



The ITE Manitoba section maintains a website at http://www.itemanitoba.ca to keep our members informed about ongoing activities throughout the year. The website contains information about the section, contacts, and notices for upcoming events.

The website also includes the Section's (draft) charter, bylaws, annual budgets and previous Annual Reports. The website is an ideal location to provide this information to our members and other visitors to the site. It also provides a means of increasing transparency in the organization.

5.2 Section Charter and By-Laws Update

In October 2013, the Section executive completed a review and update of the existing charter and bylaws. The draft versions of both documents were submitted to the CITE District in early 2014. At the time of this report, both documents are awaiting final approval of the District.

5.3 Monthly Lunch Meetings

The ITE Manitoba Section endeavors to hold monthly meetings where members and friends of ITE can network, enjoy a lunch together and take in engaging, relevant transportation engineering topics. There were eight lunch meetings in 2015, with an average attendance of close to 30.

These meetings offer an excellent opportunity for all members to keep abreast of what is going on in the profession in Manitoba and beyond. Student members are strongly encouraged to attend and are charged a discounted rate. Each presenter has their lunch paid for by the Section for their generous donation of time.

Thursday, January 22nd, 2015 John Spacek

In January 2015, John Spacek was in the position of Vice-President of **Planning** and Development, CentrePort Canada. (He has since moved on to Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation.) John has a wide and impressive array of experience in the transportation sector. John's presentation provided an update on CentrePort Canada's development and plan for the future.

Attendance: 26 professionals and 9 students.



Thursday, February 26th, 2015 Craig Milligan, P. Eng.

Craig is a road safety and asset management professional at Fireseeds North Infrastructure. His presentation, entitled "What you need to know about Manitoba's Safety Performance Functions and Network Screening Tools", introduced tools developed for MIT that will form an important part of safety management and future project work. Manitoba is the third provincial-level jurisdiction to adopt these state-of-the-art tools. The presentation concluded with a discussion on how the tolls were used to design and launch the Manitoba In-Service Road Safety Review pilot project.

Thursday, March 19th, 2015 Kean Lew Student Paper Prize Winner Adam Budowski, EIT

Adam Budowski is a recent Master's student graduate from the University of Manitoba. Upon his graduation this past spring, Adam moved to Montreal, QC to begin a term position with Eco-Counter, a company which produces pedestrian and cyclist count technologies. Adam's presentation, entitled "Developing **Expansion Factors to Estimate Cyclist Volumes in** Winnipeg", focused on the development of factors which will normalize short duration cyclist volume data across different locations in Winnipeg.

Thursday, April 9th, 2015 Kevin Amy, P. Eng.

Kevin Amy is an associate with Stantec Consulting and has over 13 years in bridge engineering and structural design. Kevin's presentation focused on replacement of the "Souris Swinging Bridge", which is an iconic Manitoba tourist attraction and vital local community link in the Town of Souris, MB. The bridge is currently Canada's longest suspension pedestrian bridge. As the design requirements for this record-breaking bridge were beyond the codes and guidelines, the military was partnered with to complete insitu dynamic testing of the bridge to evaluate pedestrian comfort and potential thrills.

Attendance: 18 professionals and 2 students.

Thursday, May 28th, 2015 Sean Rathwell, P. Eng.

Sean Rathwell is a transit and urban mobility specialist with MMM Group Limited with over 29 years of experience in both the public sector and the consulting industry. Sean's presentation on "Integrated Mobility", described how the future of mobility will see the joining of transit planning, TDM, mobility management, active transportation and smart city technology in order to develop products, services and solutions.

Attendance: 19 professionals and 5 students.

Thursday, October 15th, 2015 Scott Suderman, C.E.T., P. Eng.

Scott leads the Transportation Facilities Branch at the City of Winnipeg. His presentation drew record numbers and focused on the recent council-approved "Pedestrian and Cycling Strategy". This strategy sets out the vision for walking and cycling in Winnipeg over the next 20 years.

Thursday, November 19th, 2015 Colleen Flather, P. Eng.

Colleen is the Community Traffic Engineer for the City of Winnipeg. Colleen braved a minor car accident on her way to presenting on the topic of "The Implementation of Reduced Speed School Zones" within Winnipeg. Her presentation described the provincial regulations and the City of Winnipeg bylaw, as well as some of the challenges faced in implementation.

Attendance: 20 professionals and 8 students.

Thursday, December 10th, 2015 Brent Hartmann, P. Eng.

Brent is a highway design engineer with 9 years of experience with Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation (MIT). Brent's presentation described the "CentrePort Canada Way — Western Extension Functional Design Project", which he is managing. This new route will ensure direct access between CentrePort Canada and the TransCanada Highway west of Winnipeg, and will allow traffic to

bypass the congestive bottleneck that occurs on the existing TransCanada Highway through the town of Headingley.

Attendance: 16 professionals and 7 students.

Annual Business Meeting

Following the December technical presentation, the annual business meeting was held. The budget for 2016 was presented and approved by the membership.

5.4 Golf Tournament

7 SECTION AWARDS

7.1 Kean Lew Memorial Student Paper and Presentation Prize

The Manitoba Section gave out its annual student paper and presentation prize at the March meeting. Beginning in 2010, the award was renamed the Kean Lew Memorial Student Paper Prize after Mr. Kean Lew, P.Eng. a graduate of the University of Manitoba and former member of the ITE Manitoba Section. He was a friend of many of the members and tragically lost his life in 2009.

Requests for papers from students in the Civil Engineering program at the University of Manitoba are made at the beginning of the calendar year. Submitted papers are reviewed and scored by the ITE Manitoba executive, and the top three are invited to participate in the presentation competition. The presentations are graded by volunteer Section members and final scores are tallied. The winner is invited to present at a Section luncheon and is eligible for entry into the CITE Student Presentation Competition.

Adam Budowski was the winner of the 2015 award. Adam completed his Master of Science degree in May 2015. He has also served extensively on the Executive of the University of Manitoba ITE Student Chapter. Adam's paper/presentation was titled "Developing Expansion Factors to Estimate Cyclist Volumes in Winnipeg". Adam was awarded \$300 for his excellent work.

8 SUMMARY

The ITE Manitoba Section Executive facilitated a full year of monthly technical luncheons with the highlight being our annual golf tournament. The luncheons are an invaluable networking and information sharing opportunity within Manitoba's transportation engineering community.
