### Vibrant Communities Speaker Series

In September NACITE partnered with Urban Systems to host a Vibrant Communities Speaker Series event, which was open to the public. Darren Davis, a transit planner from Auckland, NZ spoke at the event comparing Auckland and Edmonton in terms of transit planning and bicycle planning. The event was well attended by planners, engineers and members of the public with an interest in transportation and community building.

#### NACITE Membership Survey

In the early fall of 2015 we conducted a survey of our membership to understand the value that they were getting from our existing programming. Our intent was to understand how we can improve our luncheons, and to gather ideas for additional programming we could offer. Of our 179 mailing list members, 42 responded to the survey representing a 23% response rate.

#### Partnerships with the University of Alberta Student Chapter

In late 2015 we met with the UofA Student Chapter to create a plan for hosting a Student-Industry night in spring of 2016. This meeting between the UofA Student Chapter and NACITE Executive formed the start of a number of shared initiatives between the two ITE groups.

#### Section Charter and By-laws Update

The Section does not currently have a charter of by-laws and a draft document was completed in 2015. The draft is being reviewed with the intention of presenting it to the membership for approval in fall 2016. In addition to the current executive, the document also included significant contributions from Catherine Oberg and Matthew Ivany.
