1. CHAPTER VISION

We are pleased to write this 2017 Annual Report for the British Columbia Interior Chapter of the Canadian Institute of Transportation Engineers.

The Chapter's vision is to offer all ITE members and transportation professionals in the BC Interior area of the Province of British Columbia (bounded approximately on the west by Hope, on the east by the B.C./Alberta Border, on the north by Prince George, and on the south by the Canada/U.S. border) opportunities and services that:

- · Advance CITE objectives;
- Foster closer association among Institute members;
- Encourage members to prepare and discuss papers;
- Offer suggestions on matters of policy to the Institute Board of Directors;
- Consider local transportation and traffic engineering problems and present advice and comments consistent with established Institute policies;
- Foster closer association and cooperation with local individuals and groups on matters of common interest;
- Encourage transportation and traffic engineering education in colleges, universities, and technical schools in the Chapter;
- Encourage high school and post-secondary students to enter the transportation and traffic engineering profession; and
- Encourage and support continuing education courses and programs in the area of transportation and traffic engineering.

The following sections of this report provide a summary of the Chapter's activities over the last year, 2017.

2. INTRODUCTION

At the end of 2017, there were 74 ITE members within the BC Interior Chapter of ITE. Of these members, 36 were students and 15 were members of the public sector.

4. 2017 ACTIVITIES & EVENTS

4.1. UBCO, ITE Student Chapter

In early 2013, an ITE student chapter was created at the University of British Columbia Okanagan campus (UBCO). One of the student members, Eric Ma, currently resides as the student chapter liaison



on the Executive. The 2017-2018 Annual Report of the UBCO student chapter is provided in Appendix B, and includes a variety of social, educational, and networking opportunities with members of industry.

4.2. Spring Event: Imagine Harvey Avenue: What's Sustainability got to do with it? – May 29th, Kelowna, BC

The BC Interior Chapter and UBC Okanagan jointly held this spring event which focussed on sustainable and safe infrastructure design with presentations from two guest speakers from Rotterdam, The Netherlands, including:

- 1. Peter Van Rijn, professor of Integrated Infrastructure and Safe Systems Design at Hogeschool in Rotterdam; and,
- 2. Marc Verheijen, member of faculty at Delft University of Technology and author of the book Infratecture: Infrastructure by Design (2015).

After the presentations, there were facilitated discussions intended to gather input from the public about the future of Harvey Avenue (i.e. Highway 97), a main corridor through Kelowna, BC. Questions asked to the event attendees included:

- Describe your vision of a sustainable Harvey Avenue forty years from now. What values do you attribute to your vision?
- What are the top added three design features you'd like to see now or in the future to Harvey Avenue?

Results of these questions were compiled and are provided in Appendix C. The poster for this event is also provided in this appendix.

This event format was new for the BC Interior Chapter, as it was intended to be open to all members of the public and included an optional donation to attend. The intent was to meet CITE's purpose and mission, including:

- Development of public awareness of transportation's role in society, the environment, and the economy;
- Promoting professional development of members; and,
- Exchange of professional information.

In total there were 95 attendees, and the event was so popular that there was a waiting list of about 10 people. The event was a great success and was an excellent example of bringing the CITE Interior Chapter and members of the public together to foster public awareness and promote professional development. Moreover, \$524.80 was raised in support of the Okanagan Rail Trail Initiative.

4.3. Summer Executive Patio Night - August 23, 2017



Intended as an informal, social event, the Summer Executive Patio Night was held at BNA Brewing in Kelowna, BC. Seven members of the BC Interior Chapter Executive were able to attend. The intent of the meeting was to foster team building and present a further opportunity to network.

4.4. Fall Event and AGM - November 9th, 2017

On November 9th, the CITE BC Interior Chapter hosted their annual technical mini-conference in Kelowna, BC. The mini-conference theme entitled "New Mobility: A Transportation Revolution" provided three presentations with a panel discussion in the morning, and a transit planning workshop in the afternoon. The topics covered the future of transportation, with a focus on autonomous vehicles and transit.

The presentation topics included:

- Tomorrow's Transportation Revolution: Implications for Communities by Jeremy Finkleman, Urban Systems
- Edmonton's Approach to New Transportation Technology by Erin Toop, City of Edmonton



- Vancouver's Mobility Future: "Automating" Policy Into Sustainable Results by Dale Bracewell, City
 of Vancouver
- Exploring the Era of New Mobility Panel Discussion Q&A, including Jeremy Finkleman, Erin Toop, Dale Bracewell, and moderated by Matt Worona, City of Kelowna
- Get Yer Route On: Introduction to Transit Planning by Tania Wegwitz, Watt Consulting Group and Matthew Boyd, BC Transit

About 45 public and private sector professionals attended the event, representing ITE, PIBC, UBC Okanagan, government, and consulting firms. Creative Transportation Solutions (CTS) and Urban Systems were our mini-conference sponsors. The event poster is provided in Appendix D.

During the conference, we conducted our Annual General Meeting (AGM) and Executive Elections, and we are happy to report there are both returning and new members of the BC Interior Chapter Executive. The officers were sworn in by the past president, Amanda Watson.

4.5. Future Events

In late 2016 / early 2017, we issued a survey to our members to determine what type of events they would like to attend in the future. The findings from that survey informed the events planned throughout 2017, and continue to impact event planning into 2018. Key findings of the survey suggest that in addition to typical technical presentations / workshops, members would also enjoy social events. We



plan to continue hosting day long mini-conferences since this is preferred by our members. The planned events for 2018 follow:

- Summer Informal Evening Event to be held in Kelowna, BC

5. CHAPTER OBJECTIVES

For the year of 2017, the Chapter identified the following objectives for action and priority in continuing to serve its members with a high quality CITE experience. These included the following:

Objective 1 – The BC Interior Chapter will focus on facilitating at least one technical / professional development focused event.

Objective 2 – The BC Interior Chapter will host two social networking events to provide an opportunity for professionals and students to connect in a casual atmosphere.

Objective 3 – The BC Interior Chapter Executive will execute transfer from Chapter designation to Section designation, based on the approved petition and support already given by the CITE District Executive and Board of Directors.



6. FINANCIAL REPORT

At the start of 2017, the Chapter started with \$13,918.42. By the end of 2017, the Chapter had a net loss of \$3,161.94, for a final balance of \$10,756.48. While this was a net loss, this was a deliberate decision by the Chapter to spend funds to bring high quality events to the membership and increase general public attendance at the Imagine Harvey Avenue spring event.
