4. Section Activities

CITE-SK typically organizes two (2) full-day Technical Session per year during the Spring and Fall, hosted in Regina and Saskatoon, respectively. In 2019, CITE-SK also hosted student networking night in both Regina and Saskatoon.

4.2. Fall Session

On October 22, 2018, CITE-SK hosted their Annual Fall Technical Session at the Delta Hotel in Saskatoon. Registration fees were \$60 for members, \$75 for non-members and free admission for students. 4.3. Student Pizza & Beer Night

In the winter of 2019, CITE-SK organized pizza and pint nights at the University of Saskatchewan and the University of Regina. It was a great networking opportunity for students and professionals that attended the event. Regina event had 4 students and 7 professionals attend and Saskatoon event had 19 students and 3 professionals attend.





4.4. Regina Bypass Tour

The Saskatchewan Section took a tour of the Regina Bypass project in September 2019. A total of 15 professionals attended the tour. The tour started at the Highway 1 and Highway 48 interchange east of Regina and ended at the Highway 11 and Bypass Interchange north of Regina. It was the first tour

offered that spanned the full project limits. The Saskatchewan Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure guides provided facts, tidbits and insight into the construction of the largest transportation infrastructure project in the province's history. Tour attendees were provided the opportunity to see a large borrow pit, the longest single span bridge in Saskatchewan, and to stand on the highest bridge, which is part of a three-level interchange. It was great to see members, students, and retired members participate in this outing.



4.5. Future Programs and Activities

At each of the Spring and Fall Sessions, CITE-SK conducted a survey of its attending members and friends to understand the value that they were getting from existing programming. The intent was to understand how CITE-SK can improve programming and gather ideas for additional events that could be offered.
