In line with ITE International's goal to increase membership, the Southern Alberta Section strives to increase local membership by:

### **Section Finances**

The balance of funds available at the beginning of the reporting period was \$4,596.60. Expenses and income over 2019 totaled \$20,255.84 and \$21,995.16 respectively, resulting in a year-end balance of \$4,416.97. The biggest income sources included luncheons/tours, \$13,636.76, and luncheon sponsorship, \$3,600.00. The biggest expense, \$18,238.11, was for catering and facility rental associated with luncheons and tours.




#### **Year End Gala and Poster Projects Competition**


