Date: Friday, February 7, 2020

Location: UBC

## Meeting #1: Vision Zero - City of Surrey

Date: Wednesday, February 5, 2020

Location: Surrey, BC

Presentation: Since launching Vision Zero in February 2019 the City of Surrey is emerging as a leading municipality in road safety in British Columbia and across Canada. Key to their success to date has been a strong emphasis on the role that transportation system designers play in keeping the community safe. By designing the transportation system to be forgiving of human error, mistakes do not end up costing someone their life or leaving them with life-altering injuries.

Shabnem Afzal, City of Surrey Road Safety Manager and Vision Zero Surrey Lead, presented Surrey's award-winning Vision Zero Surrey Safe Mobility Plan. The ambitious plan takes a holistic, data driven, best practice approach to road safety, with the Vision to have Zero people killed and seriously injured on Surrey roads. Shabnem shared how the City's Road Safety Team, with its partners, developed the plan following best practices from leading European and North American jurisdictions. She provided examples of key actions and interventions taken since the plan launched and how she and her team have been rolling out their implementation plan.

### Meeting #2: TransLink x City of Vancouver RapidBus Launch on 41st Avenue Corridor

Date: Thursday, March 5, 2020

Location: Burnaby, BC

Presentation: This presentation examined how the City of Vancouver and TransLink delivered a new RapidBus route and service along 41<sup>st</sup> Avenue in Vancouver with significant new transit priority measures. Bus transit ridership on this route is already the second highest in the region, but subject to much delay and unreliability. The route connects two rapid transit stations, several distinct neighborhoods and UBC.

The presentation covered the following areas: the partnership between the two organizations to deliver this significant change; building the technical case for transit priority; service planning considerations; a review of the bus priority measures (including over 13km of bus lanes) and how the design process occurred, including assessment of tradeoffs; the engagement strategy with the community, and; initial travel time savings (if available).
