Process cont'd

- Draft to TOMSC Spring 2016
- Extensive TOMSC consultation
- Consult with CCMTA and RSSC
- CCMTA had no comment
- TOMSC & RSSC comments incorporated
- Major rewrite in 2016/17
- Document scope consistent with TAC mandate



CMRR

- Intended as a reference guide
- Presents a generic set of traffic rules
- May be exceptions to the rules depending on the jurisdiction



Literature Review

- Looked at Provinces and Territories
- Looked at US, New Zealand and Australia
- Provide direction
- Not copy or rewrite CMRR to match

Key Issues

- Passing versus Overtaking
- Night time varies
- How define a bus
- How buses behave at grade crossings

What's New

- Authorized person
- Motorized Mobility Aid
- Transit signals
- Bicycle signals
- Audible Pedestrian signals



What's New cont'd

- Roundabouts
- HOV Lane
- Truck Lane
- Truck Routes
- Dangerous Goods Route

Major Points

- Definition of Night
 - Ranged from ½ hr before to 1 hr after sunset/sunrise
 - Recommend ½ hr before sunset to
 ½ hr after sunrise
 - Specifically exclude daytime running lights



Major Points cont'd

- Passing versus Overtaking
 - pass if in oncoming lane?
 - overtake if in oncoming lane?

Major Points cont'd

- Buses at grade crossings
 - stop only if uncontrolled
 - stop at all crossings
- Bus all OR school OR public OR?
- School buses stop at <u>all</u> grade crossings
